**Advanced Sea Survival Course**

5 years ago we ran this course, and as the certificates only last for 5 years we are gauging interest in who might be interested in doing either a refresher or the whole course.

Advanced Sea Survival is a comprehensive theoretical and practical course required by crew competing in offshore races (Cat 1).

Modules covered include,

- \* History, statistics and legislation
- \* Accidents and emergencies
- \* Equipment
- \* Safety and emergency planning
- \* Risk assessment
- \* Man overboard, life rafts and equipment
- \* Distress signals and responsibilities
- \* Wet drill
- \* SAR systems and responsibilities
- \* Fire precautions and fire fighting
- \* Medical care aboard
- \* Damage control
- \* Weather and forecasting
- \* Heavy weather techniques
- \* Storm sails

The price is around \$350.00 per person for the weekend, and we need at least 10 people for it to run. We would probably do it some time over the winter.
