Biosecurity NZ presentation

Friday 12 December, 7:00pm

Marine pest found in Lyttelton - your help is needed to prevent its spread.

A pest marine species, the Mediterranean fanworm has been found in Lyttelton Port.

In the meantime, MAFBNZ is asking local owners of permanently moored craft to pay particular attention to their boat cleaning regime - particularly where they are intending to move their vessel out of Lyttelton.

The fanworm is a hitchhiking pest that can grow on dirty boat bottoms and relocate to other areas. For this reason MAFBNZ says it's vital those of you with moored vessels ensure your boat's hull is clean and antifouling in good condition.

The MAFBNZ manager of the response to the fanworm, Peter Stratford, is coming along to our Friday 12 December drinks evening to talk about this pest, other marine pests and their impacts and what you can do to avoid spreading pests around our unique coastline.
